GIRLS YOUTH GROUP ORGANIZES 2nd ANNUAL CAR SHOW From Model T's to Convertible Cruisers, Cool Cars Take Center Stage at Fall Fundraising Event

Teenage fascination with cool cars is nothing new, but an entire car show organized and run by young girls, most not even old enough to drive, is probably not what you'd expect to see on a crisp September Saturday.

But that's just what the members of Job's Daughters Bethel 27, from Lakewood, are doing. Their second annual "There's Still Another Car Show To Go To Show" is Saturday, September 20, on the campus of Clover Park Technical College.

"Last year I wanted to come up with a fundraising effort that was something different," said Megan Reynolds, the 13-year-old organizer of the event. "For so many of the other things we participate in, like sports or even at school, we have to go out and sell things. By doing this, we don't have to sell anything, we just have to get the word out. People with cool cars like to take them out and show them off."

Last year nearly 30 cars were entered in the show and the girls raised more than \$500, despite rainy conditions and their first effort putting together this sort of event. This year, their goals are even higher.

"We moved our date to earlier in the fall to get better weather," explained Reynolds, "and we have a great location for cars and visitors to attend. We are hoping for at least 50 cars to enter the show, but I'd be really excited if even more came."

The show will be held adjacent to Building 3, the Automotive Technology Department, at Clover Park Technical College in Lakewood. Car registration begins at 8:30 a.m., with an entry fee of just \$15 per vehicle. There is no charge for the public to stop by and view the cars, beginning at 10:00 a.m., and an awards ceremony will wrap up the day at 2:30 p.m. Fun activities are scheduled and concessions will be available throughout the day.

Job's Daughters is an organization of young women between the ages of 10 and 20, with members throughout the world. Each local group, or Bethel, organizes several fundraisers during the year to help support their various activities, which include leadership training, service projects, social events, and more.
